Today's Readings: Jb 38:1, 8-11; Ps 107:23-24, 24-26, 28-29, 30-31; 2 Cor 5:14-17; Mk 4:35-41



Christ Walking on the Sea of Galilee by English School, 20th Century

Our readings today remind us that God always has our best interests in mind. No matter what is going on in our lives, God is with us.

In our Gospel today, Jesus and His disciples are traveling in a boat when heavy winds and violent waves begin

to overwhelm the boat. Jesus was there sleeping in the midst of this horrific storm.

The disciples woke Jesus and questioned Him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus calms the wind and the waves, and then asks them in return, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

Think back to a time that you endured great suffering, a hard trial or felt overwhelmed with life. How did you respond?

In moments of trial, we often live our days in a panic. We see the water coming into our boat and we do all that we can in our power to stay afloat. We are frantic, so we fail to stop and recognize that our Savior is in the same boat with us. Although it might feel like He is sleeping and His presence is lacking, He is right there suffering with us.

God won't allow anything that we cannot handle. In a moment of suffering, we might feel trapped. Yet, He sees the moment of peace and still waters.

During our trials, cling to Jesus. Know that there is an end, and whether we see the end in this life or the next, God allows it all for our salvation.

Today, let us thank God for His presence in our lives, and ask for the eyes of faith to see that He is right here with us always.

MASS INTENTION BOOK

Our Mass intention book for this year is quickly filling up and there is a limited amount of singular Masses available. As a reminder, St. Gabriel celebrates a Collective Mass intention most every Sunday at 8:00 AM. **What are Collective Mass intentions?** The Church allows only one intention per Mass. However, in 1991, the Congregation for the Clergy issued a decree which permitted the practice of taking more than one offering for a single Mass. Collective Mass intentions enable the faithful to combine their intentions and offerings for a celebration of a single Mass, as long as they've been previously informed and have freely consented to combining their intention and offering with others. Collective intentions are intended to accommodate the immediate needs of our parishioners, for example, the recently deceased or those needing an upcoming surgery. In accordance with Canon Law, only one stipend from the Collective Mass will go to the celebrating priest and no more than five names will be accepted for the Collective Mass.
